



"Faith Inside Will Be Seen Outside"

- 5. If someone says they have faith but is unwilling to help a brother or sister in need, what does this say about their faith?

- 1. Where are you tempted to show favoritism?
- 2. How much do you have to give?
- 3. What causes you to want to give and what keeps you from giving?
- 4. What is the greatest motivation to give?
