Epiphany

To all who are spiritually weary and seek rest; to all who mourn and long for comfort; to all who struggle and desire victory; to all who sin and need a Savior; to all who are strangers and want fellowship; to all who hunger and thirst after righteousness; and to all who will come, this church opens wide her doors and offers welcome in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ.

Epiphany comes from the Greek word ἐπιφάνεια (epipháneia), which means "manifestation" or "appearance" and is usually associated in church history with the revelation of Christ to the Magi—who then proceeded to seek, find, worship, and adorn Him.

- Not many of you should become teachers, my brothers, for you know that we who teach will be judged with greater strictness.
- ² For we all stumble in many ways. And if anyone does not stumble in what he says, he is a perfect man, able also to bridle his whole body.
- ³ If we put bits into the mouths of horses so that they obey us, we guide their whole bodies as well.
- ⁴ Look at the ships also: though they are so large and are driven by strong winds, they are guided by a very small rudder wherever the will of the pilot directs.
- ⁵ So also the tongue is a small member, yet it boasts of great things. How great a forest is set ablaze by such a small fire!
- ⁶ And the tongue is a fire, a world of unrighteousness. The tongue is set among our members, staining the whole body, setting on fire the entire course of life, and set on fire by hell.
- ⁷ For every kind of beast and bird, of reptile and sea creature, can be tamed and has been tamed by mankind,
- ⁸ but no human being can tame the tongue. It is a restless evil, full of deadly poison.
- ⁹ With it we bless our Lord and Father, and with it we curse people who are made in the likeness of God.
- ¹⁰ From the same mouth come blessing and cursing. My brothers, these things ought not to be so.
- ¹¹ Does a spring pour forth from the same opening both fresh and salt water?
- ¹² Can a fig tree, my brothers, bear olives, or a grapevine produce figs? Neither can a salt pond yield fresh water.
- ¹³ Who is wise and understanding among you? By his good conduct let him show his works in the meekness of wisdom.



- 3. Can words hurt others?
- 4. What kind of words have the power to help others?

Questions for older children

- 1. What does it mean to tame the tongue?
- 2. Why does James call the tongue a "deadly poison"?
- 3. How can our words be a blessing to others?
- 4. Why does John's Gospel refer to Jesus as the Word made flesh?
