Questions for Discussion *(may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)*

1. According to James, what is going on inside our hearts when we fight with one another?
2. What is jealousy? When is jealousy bad? When is jealousy good?
3. Why is God jealous for us?
4. How can you humble yourself before the Lord? What does God promise to do in response?
5. What is grace? Why do we need more and more of it?
