



- 1. What is an oath?
- 2. What is James teaching us about oaths?
- 3. What does James say about saying "yes" and saying "no"?
- 4. Why is it very important to keep your word?
- 5. How do we know God keeps His word?
- 6. How does God's faithfulness in keeping His word help us to keep our word?

Questions for older children

- 1. When have you experienced someone not keeping their word?
- 2. Describe a time when you didn't keep your word. What were the consequences?
- 3. Why do people not keep their word?
- 4. How does fear and misplaced fear lead to us not keeping our word?
- 5. How can the right fear help us keep our word?
