

Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Psalm 104.1-4, 31-35 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. What is "glory"?
- 2. How do we see the glory of God in creation?
- 3. How do we glorify God?
- 4. What does it mean to rejoice in God? How does God rejoice over us?

Questions for older children

- 1. How is God beautiful? How is "glory" a lot like "beauty"?
- 2. How do the stars declare the glory of God?
- 3. Why does our redemption glorify God?
- 4. Psalm 104 tells us that God is rejoicing over you. How does that change the way you rejoice in Him?
