



Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Psalm 25 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. Try and list all the ways David describes his life.
- 2. Name several of the requests David makes to God. There are at least 19.
- 3. Where can you see Jesus in this passage? Ask your parents to help explain.
- 4. How does fixing our eyes on Jesus change our lives?

Questions for older children

- 1. Why is God worthy of our trust according to David?
- 2. How have you experienced God's faithfulness?
- 3. What is the condition of your soul right now?
- 4. Are you tempted to trust something in place of God? If so, what and why?
- 5. Where do you see Jesus in this passage?
