

Scripture Reading: Genesis 4.1-17; Hebrews 11.4 *(one person read the Scripture aloud)*

Questions for Discussion *(may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)*

1. How does the book of Hebrews define faith?
2. Why did God accept Abel and his offering but reject Cain and his?
3. What is sin? How did sin affect Cain? How does sin affect us?
4. How is Jesus like Abel, only greater?

Questions for older children

1. What does it mean to be saved by faith alone and not by works?
2. What was the punishment for Cain’s sin? What is the punishment for our sin?
3. What is the city of God? How is the city of God different than our city?
4. How was the death of Jesus like the death of Abel? How was it different?

Hebrews 12.1-2

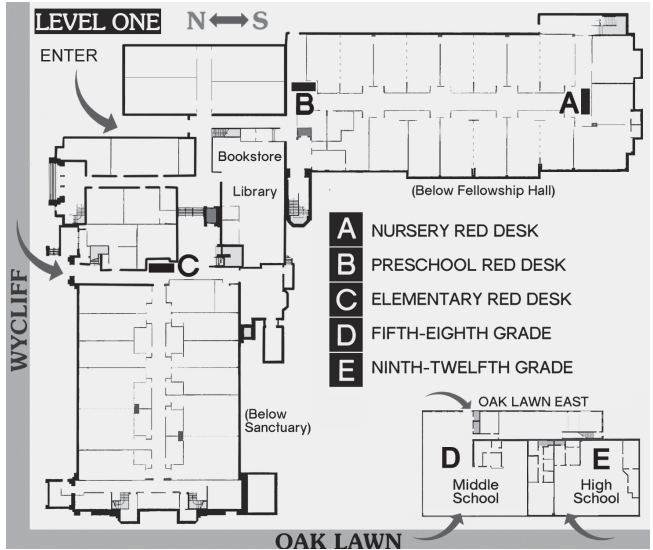
