Genesis 18.9-15

- your wife shall have a son." And Sarah was listening at the tent door behind him.
- ¹¹ Now Abraham and Sarah were old, advanced in years. The way of women had ceased to be with Sarah.
- ¹² So Sarah laughed to herself, saying, "After I am worn out, and my lord is old, shall I have pleasure?"

- ³ Abraham called the name of his son who was born to him, whom Sarah bore him, *Isaac.*
- ⁴ And Abraham circumcised his son Isaac when he was eight days old, as God had commanded him.
- ⁵ Abraham was a hundred years old when his son Isaac was born to him.
- ⁶ And Sarah said, "God has made laughter for me; everyone who hears will laugh over me."
- ⁷ And she said, "Who would have said to Abraham that Sarah would nurse children? Yet I have borne him a son in his old age."


Hebrews 11.11-12

Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Genesis 18.9-15; 21.1-7; Hebrews 11.11-12 (*one person read the Scripture aloud*)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. Have you ever had to wait for something so long that you thought it would never happen?
- 2. Why did Sarah laugh when God said she would have a son?
- 3. What question did God ask in Genesis 18.14? What is the answer?
- 4. What does Hebrews 12.2 mean when it tells us we should be "looking to Jesus?"

Questions for older children

- 1. Which promises has God made that are hard for you to believe?
- 2. Which commandment did Sarah break in Genesis 18:15?
- 3. How did the name Isaac (which means "laughter") remind Sarah both of her sin and God's faithfulness?
- 4. How does Jesus' death on the cross remind us both of our sin and God's faithfulness?
