Scripture Reading: 1 Peter 1.13-21 *(one person read the Scripture aloud)*

Questions for Discussion *(may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)*

1. What does the word “holy” mean?
2. How is God “holy”? How are we called to be “holy”?
3. How did Jesus ransom you? What did Jesus ransom you from?
4. What does it mean to belong to Jesus?

Questions for older children

1. How is holiness more than just following the rules?
2. How do we bear the image of God?
3. How does being a Christian make you different?
4. What does it mean to be united with Christ?
