

## Hearing and Learning God's Word

**Scripture Reading:** Genesis 1.1-4, 31; 2.1-3; 2 Corinthians 4.6 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

**Questions for Discussion** (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. Have you ever been in complete darkness, unable to see? What did it feel like? What did you do?
- 2. How does the Bible describe the creation before God made the light? Could it be a description of our hearts apart from God?
- 3. Why do you think God creates light first? How does light make the world a better place?
- 4. What does God call the world on the sixth day when He is finished forming and filling it? What does this tell you about God's love for the world?
- 5. Why do we need the light of Jesus shone into our hearts?
- 6. With whom can you share the light of Jesus this Christmas season?
