

Praise

Call to Worship (everyone together)

Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Genesis 15 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. What is a covenant?
- 2. What promise did God make to Abram?
- 3. What did Abram do with the animals?
- 4. How did God pass through the animal pieces?
- 5. Why did God pass through the animal pieces?
- 6. How does Christmas reveal God's Covenant?

Questions for older children

- 1. Where do you see the images of light and darkness in this passage?
- 2. What is significant about Abram not passing through the carcasses?
- 3. How does this story impact the Christmas story?
