Questions for Discussion *(may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)*

1. Who created marriage?
2. When God designs something, what can you say about His design?
3. What is the most important thing a husband and wife must remember?
4. How does the husband’s and wife’s relationship with God impact the marriage?
5. How does Peter encourage women to love God and love their husband?
6. How does Peter encourage husbands to love God and love their wife?

Questions for older children

1. How do you think most of the world views biblical marriage?
2. Why is God’s design worthy of following?
3. What makes God’s design hard for people to follow?
4. What is beautiful, powerful, and free about God’s design for marriage?
