1 Peter 3.1-7

Likewise, wives, be subject to your own husbands, so that even if some do not obey the word, they may be won without a word by the conduct of their wives,

- <sup>2</sup> when they see your respectful and pure conduct.
- <sup>3</sup> Do not let your adorning be external—the braiding of hair and the putting on of gold jewelry, or the clothing you wear—
- <sup>4</sup> but let your adorning be the hidden person of the heart with the imperishable beauty of a gentle and quiet spirit, which in God's sight is very precious.
- <sup>5</sup> For this is how the holy women who hoped in God used to adorn themselves, by submitting to their own husbands,
- <sup>6</sup> as Sarah obeyed Abraham, calling him lord. And you are her children, if you do good and do not fear anything that is frightening.





1 Peter 3.1-7 "What Your Spouse Needs Most from You"

#### Order of Worship for the Home - The Week of March 5, 2017

#### **Praise**

#### **Call to Worship** (everyone together)

Oh sing to the LORD a new song; sing to the LORD, all the earth! Sing to the LORD, bless His name; tell of His salvation from day to day.

"Amazing Grace!" (read or sing these words together)

Amazing grace!—how sweet the sound—that saved a wretch like me! I once was lost, but now am found, was blind, but now I see.

#### Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: 1 Peter 3.1-7 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

**Questions for Discussion** (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. What is most important for a husband and wife to remember about each other?
- 2. How does God want husbands to love their wives?
- 3. How does God want wives to love their husbands?
- 4. What does it mean to love sacrificially?
- 5. How did Jesus love us sacrificially?
- 6. How is Jesus the model for husbands and wives?

#### Questions for older children

- 1. How did Jesus model sacrificial authority?
- 2. How did Jesus model sacrificial submission?
- 3. Why should we trust God's design for marriage?
- 4. Why is it so hard for people to embrace God's design?
- 5. How can Jesus redeem marriage?

#### **Scripture Memory for March:** (memorize these verses of Scripture this month)

1 Peter 3.18

For Christ also suffered once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous, that He might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh but made alive in the spirit.
