

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. What are the palm branches in Revelation 7 being used for?
- 2. What do you notice about the people in heaven? Where are they from? What are they doing?
- 3. When the apostles saw Jesus ascend to His throne in heaven in Acts 1.8, what did they go out and do?
- 4. Why is starting new churches so important?
- 5. Why does Jesus appear in this heaven as a lamb? What does this tell us about how He loves us and what He has done for us?
- 6. How can you help start new churches?
