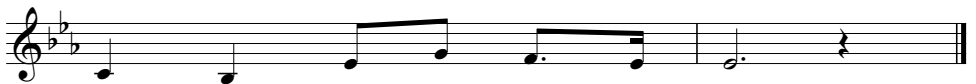



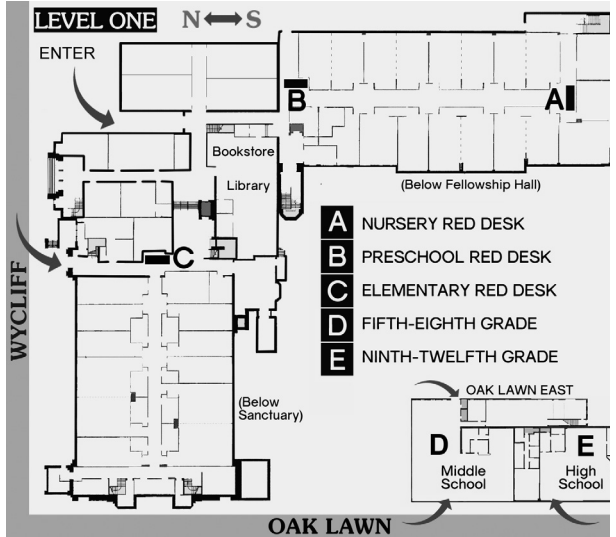

### Hearing and Learning God’s Word

#### **Scripture Reading** Acts 2.1-14, 22-24, 32-33, 36-39 *(one person read the Scripture aloud)*

#### **Questions for Discussion** *(may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)*

1. Describe what you know about the early church at this point? Does it seem like a powerful community?
2. Where do you see evidence of Jesus’ power in the passage?
3. How does the Holy Spirit empower people at Pentecost? What do they do, hear, and feel?
4. What is Peter’s message? Who is the hero?
5. What do you think it means to be “cut to the heart” in verse 37?
6. How does Peter tell his listeners to respond to the message of the gospel in verse 38?
7. In verse 39, to whom does Jesus offer His power?

#### **Scripture Memory for June** *(memorize this passage of Scripture this month)*

1 Peter 5.5

Likewise, you who are younger, be subject to the elders. Clothe yourselves, all of you, with humility toward one another, for “God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble.”
