

Praise

Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading 1 Peter 5.7 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. What have you worried about this week? Why have you worried about it?
- 2. How do you know if you are anxious? Does your body tell you? Your thoughts? Your friends and family?
- 3. Why is it important that we name our fears instead of pretending they don't exist?
- 4. Can you imagine taking your anxieties and fears into your hands, and handing them over to God? What do you think God would do or say to you? (Hint: read Matthew 11.28-30)
- 5. How does anxiety present an opportunity to be more closely connected with God?
