



Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading Luke 13.1-9 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. Why is the Cross so important to us? How does it teach us to live?
- 2. Can you think of a situation that you have been praying about for a long time? What do you hope happens? Why should you keep praying?
- 3. What sins are you currently struggling with? How can you ask God for help?
- 4. How does the parable teach us about Jesus' mercy? Do you believe Jesus is patient with you? Do you believe He is at work in your life?
- 5. What can you commit to Jesus' mercy this year? Plan to work and pray about your answer this year, and then come back and see what kind of fruit has come from Jesus' work.
