

Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading Psalm 57.1-11 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. What does it mean to take refuge?
- 2. Where is David taking refuge?
- 3. Why do people need to take refuge?
- 4. Why is David crying out to God?
- 5. How is God our great refuge?
- 6. What do verses 5 and 11 teach us about David's perspective?

Questions for older children

- 1. How can Psalm 57 be encouraging for those suffering from Hurricane Harvey?
- 2. How does David reveal God's goodness in this Psalm?
- 3. What is the message of hope we can give from Psalm 57?
