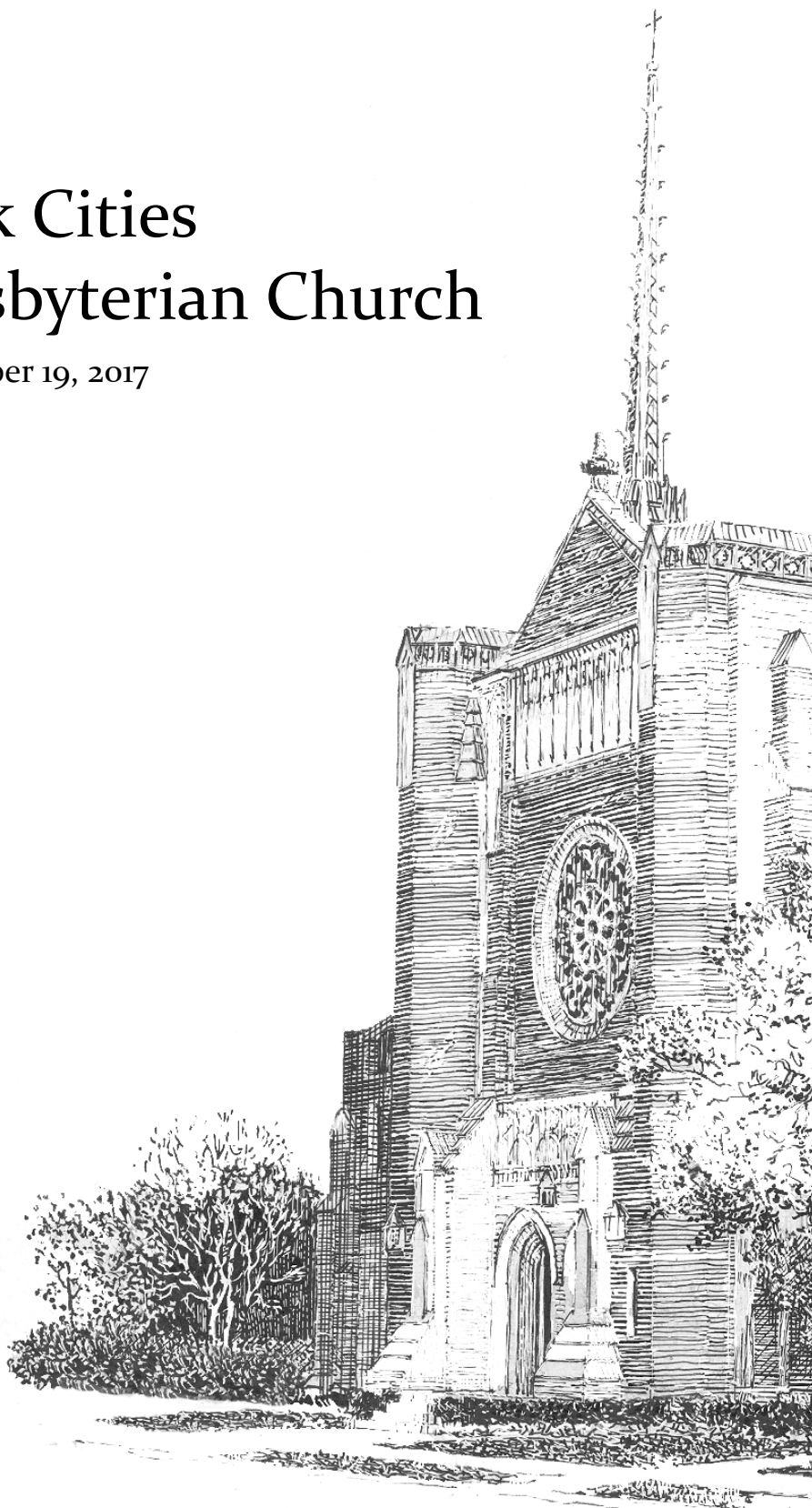



3. Describe a time when you experience awe.
4. What is the difference between awe of the creator and awe of the created things?
5. How can we have the right awe?

Questions for older children

1. What is our awe problem?
2. What must we do to exchange our broken awe?
3. What does the correct awe lead to?
4. How did their “common awe” lead to having everything in common?
