- 69 and has raised up a horn of salvation for us in the house of His servant David,
- 7º as He spoke by the mouth of His holy prophets from of old,
- ⁷¹ that we should be saved from our enemies and from the hand of all who hate us;
- ⁷² to show the mercy promised to our fathers and to remember His holy covenant,
- 73 the oath that he swore to our father Abraham, to grant us
- ⁷⁴ that we, being delivered from the hand of our enemies, might serve him without fear,
- ⁷⁵ in holiness and righteousness before Him all our days.
- ⁷⁶ And you, child, will be called the prophet of the Most High; for you will go before the Lord to prepare His ways,
- 77 to give knowledge of salvation to His people in the forgiveness of their sins,
- ⁷⁸ because of the tender mercy of our God, whereby the sunrise shall visit us from on high
- 79 to give light to those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace."
- ⁸⁰ And the child grew and became strong in spirit, and he was in the wilderness until the day of his public appearance to Israel.



- 2. After the baby was born, how did people respond to his name being John?
- 3. What does the name John mean? (Look it up if you don't know.)
- 4. What does it mean that this child will be a prophet of the Most High?
- 5. What will the Most High do?

Questions for older children

- 1. How does Zachariah's prophecy speak of our rescue?
- 2. What does Horn of Salvation mean?
- 3. How might his prophecy influence the way you celebrate Advent?

Scripture Memory for December: (memorize this passage of Scripture this month)

Luke 2.15-20

When the angels went away from them into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go over to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has made known to us." ¹⁶ And they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the Baby lying in a manger. ¹⁷ And when they saw it, they made known the saying that had been told them concerning this Child. ¹⁸ And all who heard it wondered at what the shepherds told them. ¹⁹ But Mary treasured up all these things, pondering them in her heart. ²⁰ And the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.
