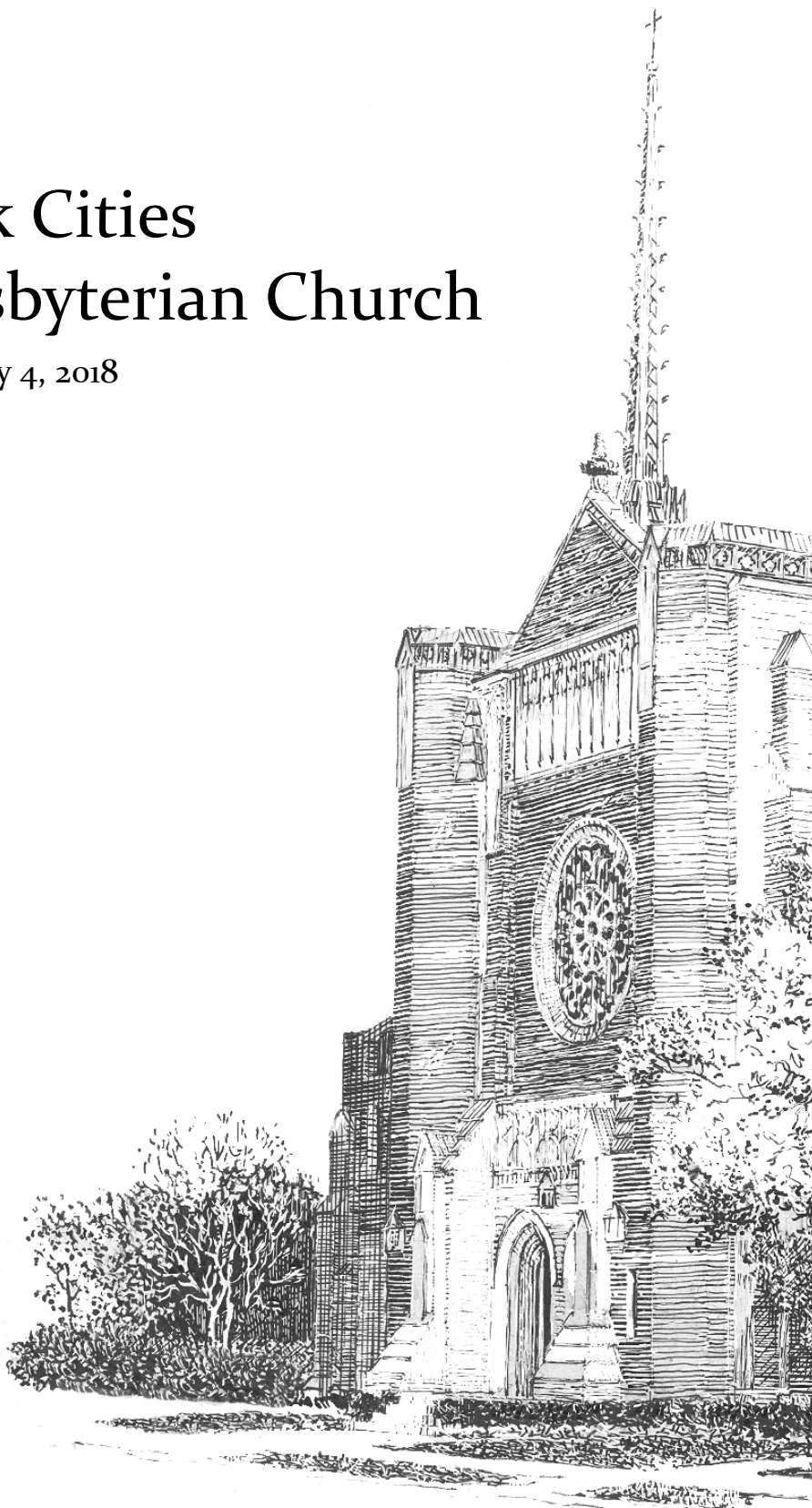

*So Peter opened his mouth and said: “Truly I understand that God shows no partiality,
³⁵ but in every nation anyone who fears Him and does what is right is acceptable to Him.
³⁶ As for the word that He sent to Israel, preaching good news of peace through Jesus Christ (He is Lord of all),
³⁷ you yourselves know what happened throughout all Judea, beginning from Galilee after the baptism that John proclaimed:
³⁸ how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power. He went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with Him.
³⁹ And we are witnesses of all that He did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They put Him to death by hanging Him on a tree,*

- ⁴⁰ but God raised Him on the third day and made Him to appear,
⁴¹ not to all the people but to us who had been chosen by God as witnesses,
who ate and drank with Him after He rose from the dead.
⁴² And He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that He is the
one appointed by God to be judge of the living and the dead.
⁴³ To Him all the prophets bear witness that everyone who believes in Him
receives forgiveness of sins through His name.”
⁴⁴ While Peter was still saying these things, the Holy Spirit fell on all who heard
the word.
⁴⁵ And the believers from among the circumcised who had come with Peter
were amazed, because the gift of the Holy Spirit was poured out even on
the Gentiles.
⁴⁶ For they were hearing them speaking in tongues and extolling God. Then
Peter declared,
⁴⁷ “Can anyone withhold water for baptizing these people, who have received
the Holy Spirit just as we have?”
⁴⁸ And he commanded them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ.
Then they asked him to remain for some days.

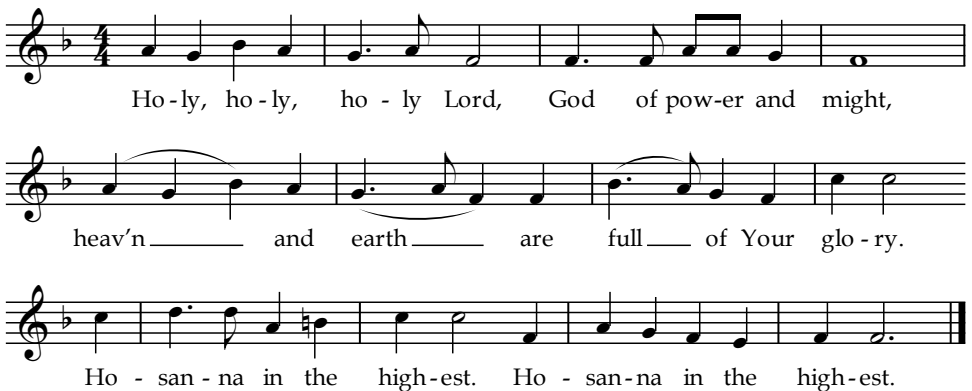

Hearing and Learning God’s Word

Scripture Reading: Acts 10.34-48 *(one person read the Scripture aloud)*

Questions for Discussion *(may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)*

1. To what group of people is Peter preaching?
2. What is Peter learning for himself as he sees the power of God at work on this new frontier?
3. What is the gospel according to Peter’s sermon?
4. Why do you think the Gospel is such a powerful message?
5. The Holy Spirit is joining the Gentiles into the Holy Spirit’s work at Pentecost (*from Acts 2*). Now they are all together in one body, with one Spirit. How does this prove Peter’s point in verse 34?
6. What are some places where you want to see God work? How can you pray for those people and places? Where is God sending you to share the gospel with others?

Scripture Memory for February: *(memorize this passage of Scripture this month)*

Acts 16.30-31.

Then he brought them out and said, “Sirs, what must I do to be saved?”

³¹ And they said, “Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved, you and your household.”
