

Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Acts 5.1-11; Matthew 13.44 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion: (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. What is a parable?
- 2. What is the lesson from the parable of the hidden treasure?
- 3. Is the story of Ananias and Sapphira a parable?
- 4. What are some of the lessons from this story?

Questions for older children

- 1. Why is the story of Ananias and Sapphira important for the Church?
- 2. What does this story and the parable teach us about treasures?
- 3. What does it mean to fear God?
- 4. How do these passages lead you to think about treasures in your own life?

Scripture Memory for June (memorize this passage of Scripture this month)

Matthew 13.44-46

The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field, which a man found and covered up. Then in his joy he goes and sells all that he has and buys that field. ⁴⁵ Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant in search of fine pearls, ⁴⁶ who, on finding one pearl of great value, went and sold all that he had and bought it.
