

Hearing and Learning God’s Word

Scripture Reading: Luke 10.25-37 *(one person read the Scripture aloud)*

Questions for Discussion: *(may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)*

1. Are you quick to ask others for help? Are you quick to help others? Which is harder for you? Why?
2. Why would being independent from other people also make us feel isolated from other people?
3. What was the role of a Jewish priest? What was the role of a Levite? Why did they pass by the man in need without helping him?
4. Who were the Samaritans? What was the relationship like between Samaritans and Jews? Why would a Samaritan helping a Jew be such a big deal?
5. According to the parable who is your neighbor? Is there anyone in your life that you need to treat more like a “neighbor”?
6. Who are you most like in the parable? Why?
7. Who is the true Good Samaritan? What has He done to rescue us?

Scripture Memory for July *(memorize this passage of Scripture this month)*

Matthew 7.24-27
