1 Samuel 18.1-12; 19.1-7; 20.30-33

*As soon as he had finished speaking to Saul, the soul of Jonathan was knit to
the soul of David, and Jonathan loved him as his own soul.*

² *And Saul took him that day and would not let him return to his father's house.*

³ *Then Jonathan made a covenant with David, because he loved him as his
own soul.*

⁴ *And Jonathan stripped himself of the robe that was on him and gave it to
David, and his armor, and even his sword and his bow and his belt.*

⁵ *And David went out and was successful wherever Saul sent him, so that Saul
set him over the men of war. And this was good in the sight of all the people
and also in the sight of Saul's servants.*

⁶ *As they were coming home, when David returned from striking down the
Philistine, the women came out of all the cities of Israel, singing and dancing,
to meet King Saul, with tambourines, with songs of joy, and with musical
instruments.*

⁷ *And the women sang to one another as they celebrated, "Saul has struck down
his thousands, and David his ten thousands."*

⁸ *And Saul was very angry, and this saying displeased him. He said, "They have
ascribed to David ten thousands, and to me they have ascribed thousands,
and what more can he have but the kingdom?"*

⁹ *And Saul eyed David from that day on.*

¹⁰ *The next day a harmful spirit from God rushed upon Saul, and he raved
within his house while David was playing the lyre, as he did day by day. Saul
had his spear in his hand.*

- ¹¹ And Saul hurled the spear, for he thought, "I will pin David to the wall." But David evaded him twice.
- ¹² Saul was afraid of David because the LORD was with him but had departed from Saul.
- ^{19,1} And Saul spoke to Jonathan his son and to all his servants, that they should kill David. But Jonathan, Saul's son, delighted much in David.
- ² And Jonathan told David, "Saul my father seeks to kill you. Therefore be on your guard in the morning. Stay in a secret place and hide yourself.
- ³ And I will go out and stand beside my father in the field where you are, and I will speak to my father about you. And if I learn anything I will tell you."
- ⁴ And Jonathan spoke well of David to Saul his father and said to him, "Let not the king sin against his servant David, because he has not sinned against you, and because his deeds have brought good to you.
- ⁵ For he took his life in his hand and he struck down the Philistine, and the LORD worked a great salvation for all Israel. You saw it, and rejoiced. Why then will you sin against innocent blood by killing David without cause?"
- ⁶ And Saul listened to the voice of Jonathan. Saul swore, "As the LORD lives, he shall not be put to death."
- ⁷ And Jonathan called David, and Jonathan reported to him all these things. And Jonathan brought David to Saul, and he was in his presence as before.
- ^{20,30} Then Saul's anger was kindled against Jonathan, and he said to him, "You son of a perverse, rebellious woman, do I not know that you have chosen the son of Jesse to your own shame, and to the shame of your mother's nakedness?"
- ³¹ For as long as the son of Jesse lives on the earth, neither you nor your kingdom shall be established. Therefore send and bring him to me, for he shall surely die."
- ³² Then Jonathan answered Saul his father, "Why should he be put to death? What has he done?"
- ³³ But Saul hurled his spear at him to strike him. So Jonathan knew that his father was determined to put David to death.

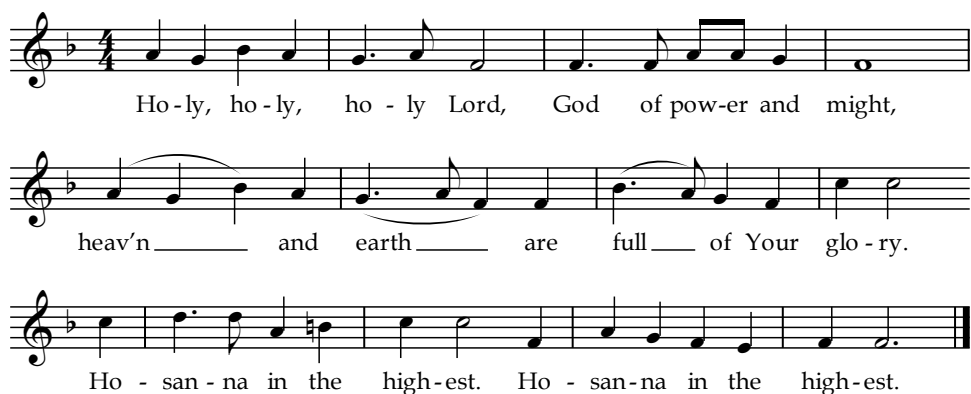

Hearing and Learning God’s Word

Scripture Reading: 1 Samuel 18.1-12; 19.1-7; 20.30-33 *(one person read the Scripture aloud)*

Questions for Discussion: *(may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)*

1. How did Jonathan respond to David (focus on 18.1-4)
2. How did Saul respond to David? (focus on 18.5-12)
3. Why do you think they responded so differently since both risked losing the same thing?
4. When did you last experience jealousy towards someone? How did it get resolved?
5. What are your un-met desires at this point in your life? Where are you disappointed or discontent? How might a relationship with Jesus meet that area of need?
6. What does it mean that Jesus is King? Does that reality feel like the loss of something or the gain of something?
