





Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: 2 Samuel 5.1-5, 10-12 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion: (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. Why does the Bible contain so many stories that deal with the messiness of people? What is the difference between prescriptive Scripture and descriptive Scripture?
- 2. What did Saul's death mean for David's kingship? And yet what did David do when he learned that Saul had died? What does this say about David's heart?
- 3. Who challenged David's kingly right to reign over Israel? What had to happen for David to become king over all of Israel?
- 4. What is sin? Why is sin so contrary to the character of God? What was the sin that led to David becoming king of Israel?
- 5. 2 Samuel 5.12 says that it was God who established David as king over Israel. How do we reconcile this with the sorrow and sin that led to David being crowned as king? Acts 2.23 says that Jesus was "delivered up according to the definite plan and foreknowledge of God." How do we reconcile this with the sorrow and sin that led to the cross?
- 6. How did God break into the broken mess of humanity? How has the kingly reign of Jesus Christ delivered us from sorrow and sin?
