

*The Scripture Reading

I Kings 18.17-25, 29-40; James 1.5-8

When Ahab saw Elijah, Ahab said to him, "Is it you, you troubler of Israel?"

- ¹⁸ And he answered, "I have not troubled Israel, but you have, and your father's house, because you have abandoned the commandments of the LORD and followed the Baals.
- Now therefore send and gather all Israel to me at Mount Carmel, and the 450 prophets of Baal and the 400 prophets of Asherah, who eat at Jezebel's table.
- ²⁰ So Ahab sent to all the people of Israel and gathered the prophets together at Mount Carmel.
- ²¹ And Elijah came near to all the people and said, "How long will you go limping between two different opinions? If the LORD is God, follow Him; but if Baal, then follow him." And the people did not answer him a word.
- ²² Then Elijah said to the people, "I, even I only, am left a prophet of the LORD, but Baal's prophets are 450 men.
- ²³ Let two bulls be given to us, and let them choose one bull for themselves and cut it in pieces and lay it on the wood, but put no fire to it. And I will prepare the other bull and lay it on the wood and put no fire to it.
- ²⁴ And you call upon the name of your god, and I will call upon the name of the LORD, and the God who answers by fire, He is God." And all the people answered, "It is well spoken."
- ²⁵ Then Elijah said to the prophets of Baal, "Choose for yourselves one bull and prepare it first, for you are many, and call upon the name of your god, but put no fire to it.'
- And as midday passed, they raved on until the time of the offering of the oblation, but there was no voice. No one answered; no one paid attention.
- Then Elijah said to all the people, "Come near to me." And all the people came near to him. And he repaired the altar of the LORD that had been thrown down.
- ³¹ Elijah took twelve stones, according to the number of the tribes of the sons of Jacob, to whom the word of the LORD came, saying, "Israel shall be your name," and with the stones he built an altar in the name of the LORD. And he made a
- trench about the altar, as great as would contain two seahs of seed.
- 33 And he put the wood in order and cut the bull in pieces and laid it on the wood. And he said, "Fill four jars with water and pour it on the burnt offering and on the wood."
- ³⁴ And he said, "Do it a second time." And they did it a second time. And he said, "Do it a third time." And they did it a third time.

 35 And the water ran around the altar and filled the trench also with water.
- ³⁶ And at the time of the offering of the oblation, Elijah the prophet came near and said, "O LORD, God of Abraham, Isaac, and Israel, let it be known this day that You are God in Israel, and that I am Your servant, and that I have done all these things at Your word.
- ³⁷ Answer me, O LORD, answer me, that this people may know that You, O LORD, are God, and that You have turned their hearts back.'
- Then the fire of the LORD fell and consumed the burnt offering and the wood and the stones and the dust, and licked up the water that was in the trench.
- ³⁹ And when all the people saw it, they fell on their faces and said, "The LORD, He is God; the LORD, He is God."
- ⁴⁰ And Elijah said to them, "Seize the prophets of Baal; let not one of them escape." And they seized them. And Elijah brought them down to the brook Kishon and slaughtered them there.



Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: I Kings 18.17-25, 29-40; James 1.5-8 (one person read the *Scripture aloud*)

Questions for Discussion: (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. What did Elijah mean by the words: "How long will you limp (waver) between the two sides"? See 1 Kings 18.21
- 2. Why did the people not answer the question?
- 3. Elijah set up twelve stones for the altar he used. What was his purpose? See verses 30-32
- 4. What do we learn from Elijah's prayer? See verse 36
- 5. Why were the prophets of Baal slain? See Deuteronomy 13.13-15 and 1 Kings 18.4, 13
- 6. When fire came from heaven, how did the people respond? Do you think it lasted? Why or why not?
