

Questions for Discussion: *(may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)*

1. What does Hosanna mean?
2. The Psalmist said he was in distress (trouble). How does he describe this distress in 10-13?
3. When have you felt distressed, like a swarm of bees surrounding you?
4. The Psalmist says he is not afraid. What gives him his courage?
5. Read verses 5-7. What can man do to us?
6. What two things can man not do to us? (Hint: they both start with the letter “D”.)
7. Where must we seek our refuge?
8. How does this Psalm show us that the Lord is God and that He is good?
9. How can we give thanks to God during Holy Week?
