

Hearing and Learning God’s Word

Scripture Reading: Jude 24-25 *(one person read the Scripture aloud)*

Questions for Discussion: *(may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)*

1. What does Jude tell us God is able to do?
2. What does it mean to stumble, and what kind of stumbling is Jude talking about?
3. What does it mean that we will be presented (or stand) blameless before His glory?
4. How do these verses encourage you in your walk with Jesus now, and in light of eternity?
