





Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Romans 15.13 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion: (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. What is hope and where does it come from?
- 2. What is a situation in your own life where you need hope or rely on hope?
- 3. How do we find hope in the death of Jesus? The resurrection of Jesus? The return of Jesus?
- 4. What would it look like (what might change or improve) if we surrendered to the power of the Holy Spirit in us to make hope abound and overflow in our lives? Where would we see it flowing first?
