



## **Hearing and Learning God's Word**

Scripture Reading: Numbers 6.22-27; Psalm 67 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

- 1. Why is it important that God told the priest how to bless the people?
- 2. What does it mean for the Lord "to keep you"?
- 3. What does it mean for God's face "to shine on us"?
- 4. How do we know we have received the blessing?
- 5. Why does God bless us? Is it more than just love? (see Numbers 6.27 and Psalm 67)
