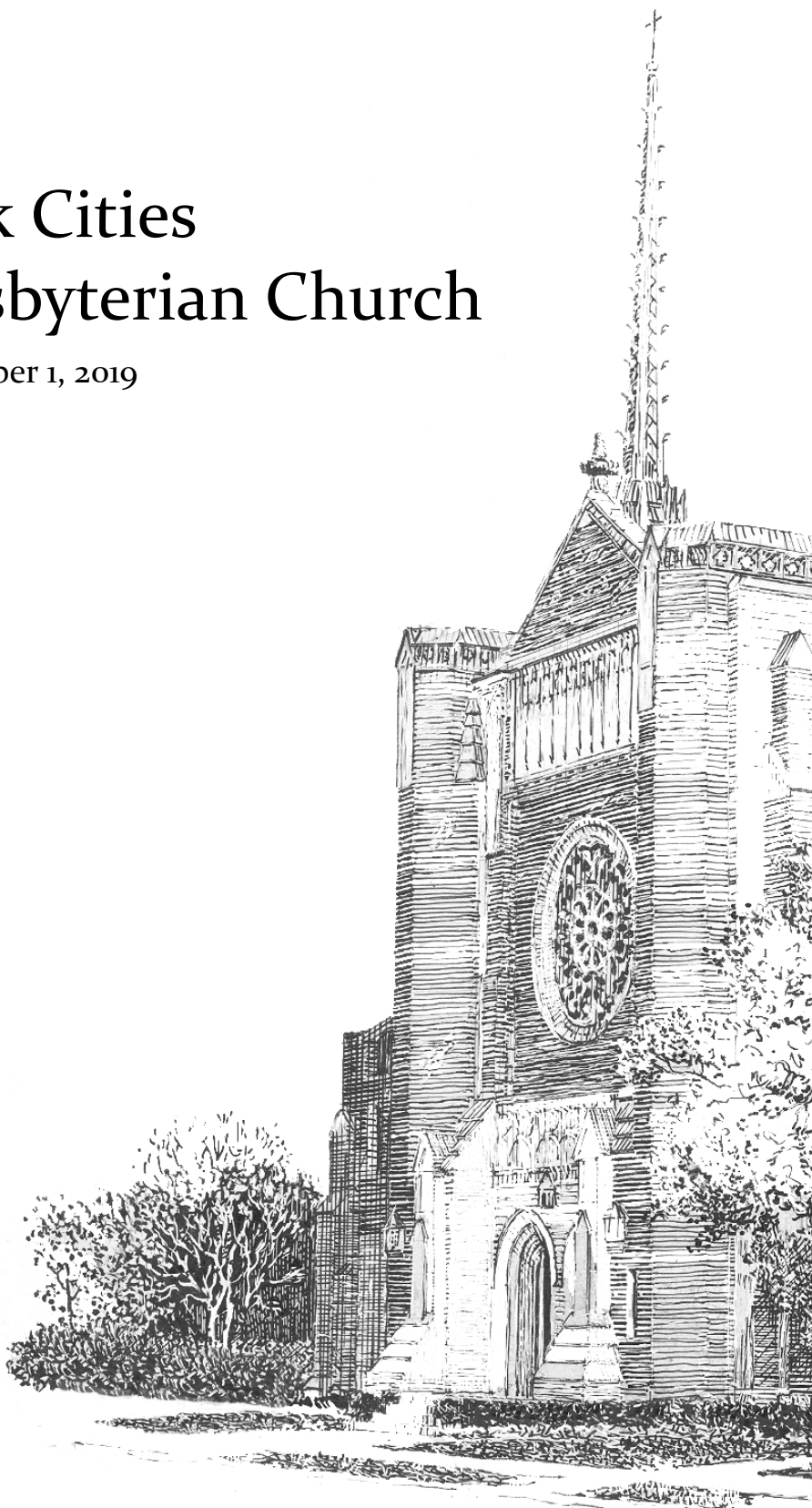



Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: 1 John 2:15-16; Galatians 5:16-24; 1 Timothy 4:1 *(one person read the Scripture aloud)*

Questions for Discussion: *(may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)*

1. In 1 John 2:15-16, what is the world?
2. How do these passages reveal the schemes of Satan?
3. What is Satan's primary plan of attack? *(refer back to Genesis 3 and Matthew 4)*
4. Why is God's Word so important for us in this battle?

Scripture Memory for September: *(memorize this passage of Scripture this month)*

Hebrews 1:1-2
