

Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Hebrews 1.1-2, 2.3 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion: (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. Have you ever taken something for granted? What might it look like to take Christianity for granted?
- 2. In our Western world, how do we know that something is true? Why does Jesus say that He is "The Truth"? How do you know that Jesus is true?
- 3. What is the difference between believing in God and believing God? How is the Christian faith about much more than simply believing that God exists?
- 4. Is there anything in your life that you struggle to submit to the authority of Jesus Christ?
- 5. Why did Jesus equate sin with slavery? Why then do we so often equate sin with freedom?
- 6. Where was Jesus when God created the world? What does Jesus' role in creation teach us about His role in our redemption?
- 7. Is there any part of your life that you think is too big for Jesus to handle? Is there any part of your life that you think is too small for Jesus to care about?
