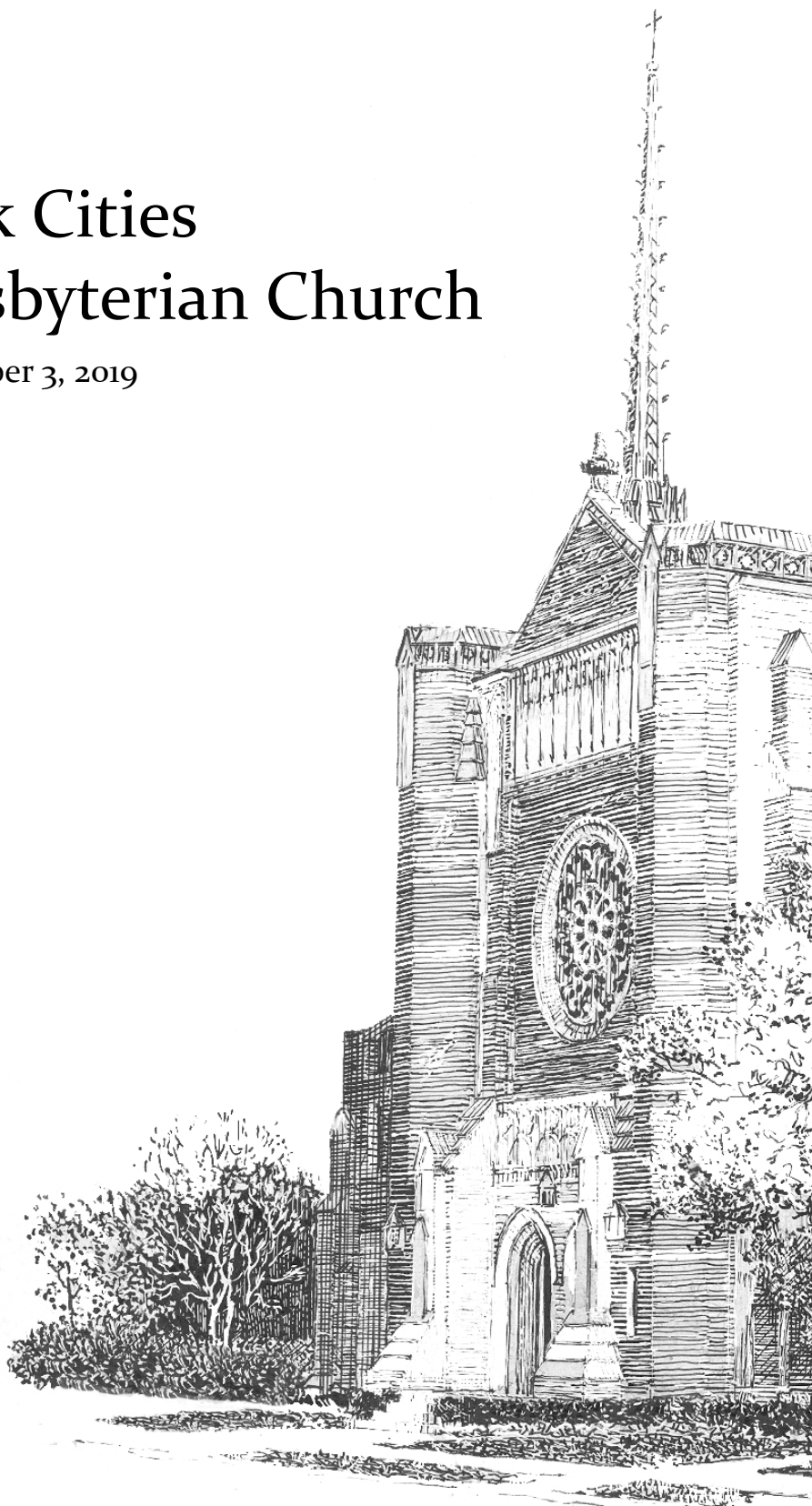

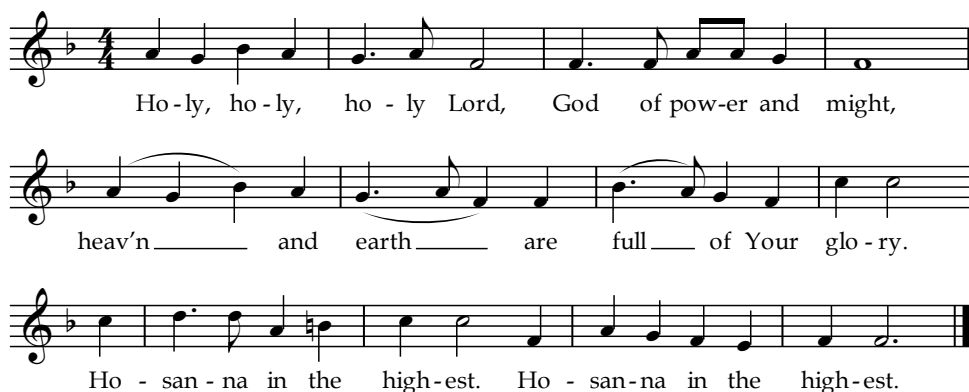

3. How did Christ suffer when tempted?
4. How does Christ’s suffering help us when we are tempted?
5. What does God promise us to help us when we are tempted?

**Scripture Memory for November:** *(memorize this passage of Scripture this month)*

Hebrew 2.18

For because He Himself has suffered when tempted, He is able to help those who are being tempted.
