

- 2. What does it mean for faith to be tested? Has your faith ever been tested?
- 3. What is the difference between doubt and unbelief? What does unbelief have to do with disobedience? What does faith have to do with obedience?
- 4. Can someone with authentic faith ever lose it? Why? What does it mean for faith to persevere?
- 5. What is the Holy Spirit's role when it comes to faith? How does this make faith a gift?
- 6. Why is the object of our faith more important than the strength of our faith? What assurance does this give?
