

Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Hebrews 5.11-14 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion: (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. How does the author of Hebrews describe the people's hearing? What does this mean?
- 2. What makes people dull of hearing?
- 3. How was their dullness of hearing manifest?
- 4. What is the difference between milk and solid food in the passage?
- 5. How would you define your hearing? How do you know?

Hebrews 4.14-16
