

*The Scripture Reading

Hebrews 6.11-20

And we desire each one of you to show the same earnestness to have the full assurance of hope until the end,

- ¹² so that you may not be sluggish, but imitators of those who through faith and patience inherit the promises.
- ¹³ For when God made a promise to Abraham, since He had no one greater by whom to swear, He swore by Himself,
- ¹⁴ saying, "Surely I will bless you and multiply you."
- ¹⁵ And thus Abraham, having patiently waited, obtained the promise.

- ¹⁶ For people swear by something greater than themselves, and in all their disputes an oath is final for confirmation.
- ¹⁷ So when God desired to show more convincingly to the heirs of the promise the unchangeable character of His purpose, He guaranteed it with an oath,
- so that by two unchangeable things, in which it is impossible for God to lie, we who have fled for refuge might have strong encouragement to hold fast to the hope set before us.
- ¹⁹ We have this as a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul, a hope that enters into the inner place behind the curtain,
- where Jesus has gone as a forerunner on our behalf, having become a High Priest forever after the order of Melchizedek.



Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Hebrews 6.11-20 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion: (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. What does it mean to be sure of something? What is the difference between being sure of yourself and the kind of assurance that can only be found in God?
- 2. What did God promise to Abraham? (Read Genesis 17.1-8) What do God's promises to Abraham have to do with us? (Read Galatians 3.26-29)
- 3. How have you seen the faithfulness of God in your own life?
- 4. What does Christian faith have to trust? What does it mean to trust God?
- 5. What does the word "Amen" mean? Why do we say "Amen" at the end of our prayers?
- 6. Why was the anchor used as a Christian symbol during the first century? How is Jesus the "anchor of the soul"? (Read Hebrews 6.19)
- 7. How can you be sure that you have eternal life?

Scripture Memory for January: (memorize this passage of Scripture this month)

Hebrews 4.14-16

Since then we have a great High Priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession. ¹⁵ For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin. ¹⁶ Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need.
