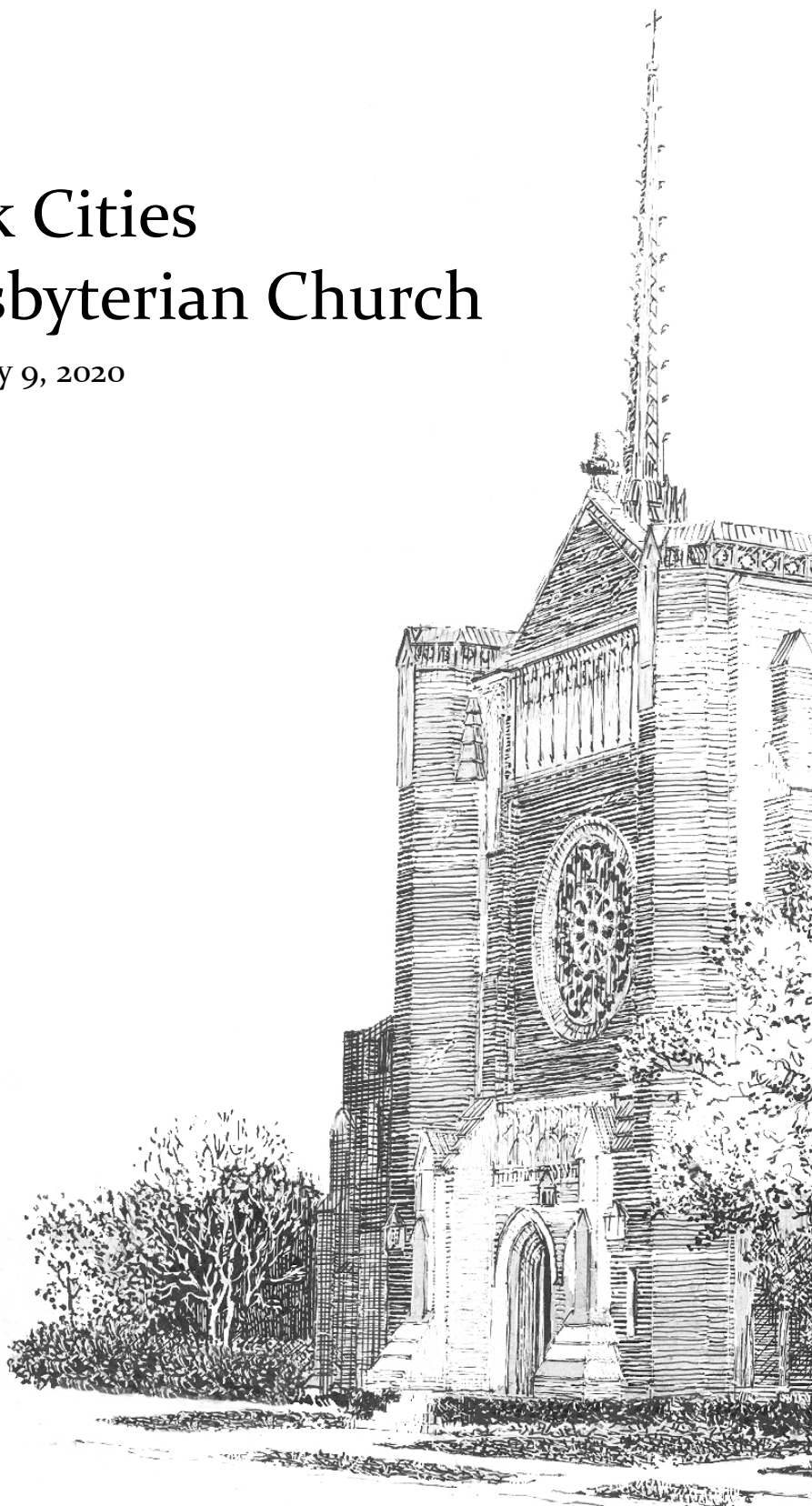

Hearing and Learning God’s Word

Scripture Reading: Hebrews 10.19-25 *(one person read the Scripture aloud)*

Questions for Discussion: *(may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)*

1. What is significant about Jesus being the Great High Priest over the house of God? (vs 19-20)
2. How are we to draw near? (v 22)
3. How are we to hold fast? (v 23)
4. What does it mean to stir one another up to love and good works? (v 24)
5. What happens when we meet together? (v 25)

Scripture Memory for February: *(memorize this passage of Scripture this month)*

Hebrews 9.11-12

But when Christ appeared as High Priest of the good things that have come, then through the greater and more perfect tent (not made with hands, that is, not of this creation) ¹² He entered once for all into the holy places, not by means of the blood of goats and calves but by means of His own blood, thus securing an eternal redemption.

Prayer
