First Sunday of Lent

Lent is a season of preparation and repentance during which we anticipate Good Friday and Easter. The practice of a forty-day preparation period began in the Christian church during the third and fourth centuries. The number forty carries biblical significance based on the forty years Israel spent in the wilderness and Jesus' forty-day fast in the wilderness.

As a period of preparation, Lent has historically included the instruction of persons for baptism and profession of faith; the calling back of those who have become estranged from the church; and efforts by all Christians to deepen their piety, devotion, and readiness to mark the death and resurrection of their Savior. Symbolizing the season, the Chancel Choir will be wearing black robes during Lent.





Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Hebrews 11.1-2, 13-16, 39-40 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion: (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. What are some ways that we misunderstand doubt? What are some ways that we misunderstand faith?
- 2. What is the difference between believing in God and believing God? What does faith have to do with trust?
- 3. The author of Hebrews describes faith as both "assurance" and "conviction." How does your faith compare to this definition?
- 4. Do you think that God is pleased with you? According to the author of Hebrews, what pleases God? (See Hebrews 11.6)
- 5. What does it mean to be saved through faith alone and not by works? Are there any ways that you tried to add to this gracious truth?
- 6. What does faith have to do with waiting? What were the Old Testament people of faith waiting for? What are we waiting for? What makes it so hard to wait?
- 7. What does our faith have to do with the faithfulness of God?

Hebrews 12.1-2
