The Scripture Reading

John 8.23-25, 31-36, 48-59

He said to them, "You are from below; I am from above. You are of this world; I am not of this world.

- ²⁴ I told you that you would die in your sins, for unless you believe that I am He you will die in your sins."
- ²⁵ So they said to Him, "Who are You?" Jesus said to them, "Just what I have been telling you from the beginning.
- ³¹ So Jesus said to the Jews who had believed Him, "If you abide in My word, you are truly My disciples,
- ³² and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free."
- 33 They answered Him, "We are offspring of Abraham and have never been enslaved to anyone. How is it that you say, 'You will become free'?"
- ³⁴ Jesus answered them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, everyone who practices sin is a slave to sin
- 35 The slave does not remain in the house forever; the son remains forever.
- ³⁶ So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed.
- ⁴⁸ The Jews answered Him, "Are we not right in saying that You are a Samaritan and have a demon?"
- ⁴⁹ Jesus answered, "I do not have a demon, but I honor My Father, and you dishonor Me.
- ⁵⁰ Yet I do not seek My own glory; there is One who seeks it, and He is the judge.
- ⁵¹ Truly, truly, I say to you, if anyone keeps My word, he will never see death."
- 52 The Jews said to Him, "Now we know that You have a demon! Abraham died, as did the prophets, yet You say, 'If anyone keeps My word, he will never taste death.'
- 53 Are You greater than our father Abraham, who died? And the prophets died! Who do You make Yourself out to be?"
- Jesus answered, "If I glorify Myself, My glory is nothing. It is My Father who glorifies Me, of whom you say, 'He is our God.'
- 55 But you have not known Him. I know Him. If I were to say that I do not know Him, I would be a liar like you, but I do know Him and I keep His word.
- ⁵⁶ Your father Abraham rejoiced that he would see My day. He saw it and was glad."
- ⁵⁷ So the Jews said to Him, "You are not yet fifty years old, and have You seen Abraham?"
- ⁵⁸ Jesus said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, before Abraham was, I AM."
- ⁵⁹ So they picked up stones to throw at Him, but Jesus hid Himself and went out of the temple.
