²⁹ “Come, see a man who told me all that I ever did. Can this be the Christ?”

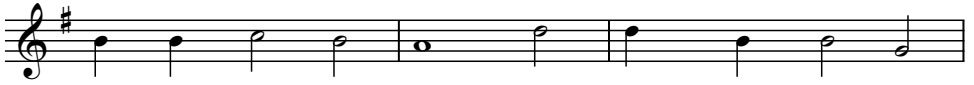
