

behold, your King is coming,


sitting on a donkey's colt!"

See, from His head, His hands, His feet, sorrow and love flow mingled down; did e'er such love and sorrow meet, or thorns compose so rich a crown.


Were the whole realm of nature mine, that were a present far too small; love so amazing, so divine, demands my soul, my life, my all!
