





*The Scripture Reading: Jeremiah 29.1-14; Daniel 7.13-14 Mr. Williams 8:00 David Williams 9:30/11:00 Church Planting Pastoral Resident

Jeremiah 29.1-14

- These are the words of the letter that Jeremiah the prophet sent from Jerusalem to the surviving elders of the exiles, and to the priests, the prophets, and all the people, whom Nebuchadnezzar had taken into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon.
- ² This was after King Jeconiah and the queen mother, the eunuchs, the officials of Judah and Jerusalem, the craftsmen, and the metal workers had departed from Jerusalem.
- ³ The letter was sent by the hand of Elasah the son of Shaphan and Gemariah the son of Hilkiah, whom Zedekiah king of Judah sent to Babylon to Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon. It said:
- ⁴ "Thus says the LORD of hosts, the God of Israel, to all the exiles whom I have sent into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon:
- ⁵ Build houses and live in them; plant gardens and eat their produce.
- ⁶ Take wives and have sons and daughters; take wives for your sons, and give your daughters in marriage, that they may bear sons and daughters; multiply there, and do not decrease.
- ⁷ But seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the LORD on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your welfare.
- ⁸ For thus says the LORD of hosts, the God of Israel: Do not let your prophets and your diviners who are among you deceive you, and do not listen to the dreams that they dream,
- ⁹ for it is a lie that they are prophesying to you in My name; I did not send them, declares the LORD.
- "For thus says the LORD: When seventy years are completed for Babylon, I will visit you, and I will fulfill to you My promise and bring you back to this place.
- ¹¹ For I know the plans I have for you, declares the LORD, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope.
- ¹² Then you will call upon Me and come and pray to Me, and I will hear you.
- ¹³ You will seek Me and find Me, when you seek Me with all your heart.

I will be found by you, declares the LORD, and I will restore your fortunes and gather you from all the nations and all the places where I have driven you, declares the LORD, and I will bring you back to the place from which I sent you into exile."

Daniel 7.13-14

- ¹³ "I saw in the night visions, and behold, with the clouds of heaven there came One like a Son of Man, and He came to the Ancient of Days and was presented before Him.
- ¹⁴ And to Him was given dominion and glory and a Kingdom, that all peoples, nations, and languages should serve Him; His dominion is an everlasting dominion, which shall not pass away, and His Kingdom one that shall not be destroyed."

Jeremiah 29.1-14; Daniel 7.13-14 "Faithfulness in a Faithless World"

Discussion Questions

	e following questions help us dialog with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this orning's worship service. Together, these elements provide space for reflection and prayer during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship.
1.	What is an exile? How were the people of Israel living as exiles in Babylon? As Christians, how are we living as exiles today?
2.	In what way is this world not our home? Why is this both a promise and a warning?
3.	As the people of God, how do we avoid our culture? How do we accommodate our culture? How does Jeremiah call us to relate to our culture?
4.	What does it mean to "seek the welfare of the city?" (See Jeremiah 29.7) What are some ways you can do this in your everyday life?
5.	Read Jeremiah 29.11. How does the context of judgment and exile change the way you read this verse?
6.	What does the fall of Adam and Eve have to do with exile? (See Genesis 3.22-24) Who is the only one that can bring us back to our garden home?

7. Who is the main character of the book of Daniel? (See Daniel 7.13-14)

What does this teach us about the faithfulness of God?
