

- ³ "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the Kingdom of heaven."



Discussion Questions

The following questions help us dialog with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this morning's worship service. Together, these elements provide space for reflection and prayer during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship.

- 1. What is the Kingdom of God? How does it compare to the kingdom of man?
- 2. Take a moment to read the Sermon on the Mount. (Matthew 5.3-7.27) What parts were most encouraging? What parts were most challenging?
- 3. How does the Sermon on the Mount describe life in the Kingdom of God? Where do you need the Kingdom of God in your own life?
- 4. What does the word "gospel" mean? Why is the Kingdom of God such good news?
- 5. Why does Jesus say that "the Kingdom of heaven is at hand"? (Matthew 4.17) How is the Kingdom of God near to you?
- 6. What does the Gospel of the Kingdom have to do with the death and resurrection of Jesus? What does the Gospel of the King have to do with His return?
- 7. How does the Gospel of the Kingdom give you hope?
