





Matthew 5.21-24 "Anger and the Cross"

Discussion Questions

The following questions help us dialog with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this morning's worship service. Together, these elements provide space for reflection and prayer during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship. 1. What is significant about the way Jesus connects to the Ten Commandments and then expands the meaning? 2. What is anger? 3. What is Jesus teaching His followers about anger? 4. What are the consequences of anger? 5. How does Jesus instruct His followers to respond to conflict? 6. How does the gospel impact our ability to deal with anger and conflict the way Christ is instructing us? 7. Where in your life have you experienced reconciliation? 8. Where in your life do you need to pursue reconciliation? Ask the Holy Spirit to guide you toward reconciliation.
