

Matthew 5:38-42
“The Glory of Humiliation”

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

The following questions help us dialog with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this morning's worship service. Together, these elements provide space for reflection and prayer during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship.

1. What is revenge? Why do we want to get even with those who would humiliate us and do us harm?
2. Why makes revenge completely contrary to the Gospel of Jesus Christ?
3. What does it mean to be humiliated? How was Jesus humiliated?
4. What does it mean to "turn the other cheek"? How did Jesus do this for us?
5. How can we show grace to those who sin against us? Why would Jesus call us to live graciously?
6. What did it mean to "go the extra mile" in ancient Israel? What makes this so hard for us today?
7. What does generosity have to do with humility? How has Jesus been generous with us?
8. Why would Jesus call us to embrace humiliation for the glory of His Kingdom? What does the cross of Christ teach us about the glory of humility?
