## DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

5. How have you experienced the Father answering this prayer?

### **Prayer Prompts:**

*Use the following prompts to guide you in prayer this week: Matthew 6.9-13  
"Deliver us from evil"*

1. Praise God for His infinite and almighty power over all things.
2. Ask God to guard you in the particular temptations, deceptions, and dangers you are facing today using the words of 2 Thessalonians 3.3, "The Lord is faithful. He will establish you and guard you against the evil one."
3. Pray for God to protect our church from Satan's evil schemes to distract us, to divide us, and discourage us.
4. Give God praise for the promise of Psalm 91.9-10, "Because you have made the LORD your dwelling place, the Most High who is my refuge, no evil shall be allowed to befall you."
