





Discussion Questions

5.	In Exodus 4.24-26 what are significant biblical themes that are revealed?

7.	What can we learn from Zipporah's actions and how do they relate to the history of redemption?
8.	How does this passage point to Jesus, the only begotten Son of God?
9.	How can this passage impact our lives today?
