





nor height nor depth,





## Discussion Questions

The following questions help us dialog with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this

m	norning's worship service. Together, these elements provide space for reflection and prayer during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship.
1.	We can say that we believe God loves us, but do you have this gnawing suspicion that God is disappointed with you? That His patience is wearing thin with you? Or that His grace and mercy have reached their limit and are about to run out?
2.	When you fear (are afraid of) God, what lies about God are you believing? And how does your fear affect your relationship with God and others?
3.	Does our sin jeopardize God's presence from dwelling with us?
4.	How have you made God into the image you want Him to be?
5.	What is the face of God, and where does God's glory shine the brightest?
