



*The Scripture Reading: Numbers 16.1-5; 17.1-12, Hebrews 7.11-19

Numbers 16.1-5; 17.1-12

- ^{16.1}Now Korah the son of Izhar, son of Kohath, son of Levi, and Dathan and Abiram the sons of Eliab, and On the son of Peleth, sons of Reuben, took men.
- ² And they rose up before Moses, with a number of the people of Israel, 250 chiefs of the congregation, chosen from the assembly, well-known men.
- ³ They assembled themselves together against Moses and against Aaron and said to them, "You have gone too far! For all in the congregation are holy, every one of them, and the LORD is among them. Why then do you exalt yourselves above the assembly of the LORD?"
- 4 When Moses heard it, he fell on his face,
- ⁵ and he said to Korah and all his company, "In the morning the LORD will show who is His, and who is holy, and will bring him near to Him. The one whom He chooses He will bring near to Him.
- ^{17.1}The LORD spoke to Moses, saying,
- ² "Speak to the people of Israel, and get from them staffs, one for each fathers' house, from all their chiefs according to their fathers' houses, twelve staffs. Write each man's name on his staff,
- ³ and write Aaron's name on the staff of Levi. For there shall be one staff for the head of each fathers' house.
- ⁴ Then you shall deposit them in the tent of meeting before the testimony, where I meet with you.
- ⁵ And the staff of the man whom I choose shall sprout. Thus I will make to cease from Me the grumblings of the people of Israel, which they grumble against you."
- ⁶ Moses spoke to the people of Israel. And all their chiefs gave him staffs, one for each chief, according to their fathers' houses, twelve staffs. And the staff of Aaron was among their staffs.
- ⁷ And Moses deposited the staffs before the LORD in the tent of the testimony.
- ⁸ On the next day Moses went into the tent of the testimony, and behold, the staff of Aaron for the house of Levi had sprouted and put forth buds and produced blossoms, and it bore ripe almonds.
- ⁹ Then Moses brought out all the staffs from before the LORD to all the people of Israel. And they looked, and each man took his staff.
- ¹⁰ And the LORD said to Moses, "Put back the staff of Aaron before the testimony, to be kept as a sign for the rebels, that you may make an end of their grumblings against Me, lest they die."
- ¹¹ Thus did Moses; as the LORD commanded him, so he did.
- ¹² And the people of Israel said to Moses, "Behold, we perish, we are undone, we are all undone.

Hebrews 7.11-19

- Now if perfection had been attainable through the Levitical priesthood (for under it the people received the law), what further need would there have been for another priest to arise after the order of Melchizedek, rather than one named after the order of Aaron?
- ¹² For when there is a change in the priesthood, there is necessarily a change in the law as well.
- For the one of whom these things are spoken belonged to another tribe, from which no one has ever served at the altar.
- ¹⁴ For it is evident that our Lord was descended from Judah, and in connection with that tribe Moses said nothing about priests.
- ¹⁵ This becomes even more evident when another priest arises in the likeness of Melchizedek,
- ¹⁶ who has become a priest, not on the basis of a legal requirement concerning bodily descent, but by the power of an indestructible life.
- ¹⁷ For it is witnessed of Him, "You are a priest forever, after the order of Melchizedek."
- ¹⁸ For on the one hand, a former commandment is set aside because of its weakness and uselessness
- ¹⁹ (for the law made nothing perfect); but on the other hand, a better hope is introduced, through which we draw near to God.



SERMON NOTES

Numbers 16.1-5; 17.1-12, Hebrews 7.11-19 "A Better Hope"

Discussion Questions

The following questions help us dialog with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this morning's worship service. Together, these elements provide space for reflection and prayer during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship.	
1.	In Numbers 17.5, God says He would give the Israelites a sign to help their grumbling about the priests to cease. How does giving a sign demonstrate God's patience, grace, and wisdom?
2.	Read Numbers 17.8 and Jeremiah 1.11-12. Why is it both surprising and significant that Aaron's staff produced ripe almonds? How does this agricultural imagery illustrate God's faithfulness to provide redemption in Jesus Christ?
3.	Read Hebrews 7.11-16. Why does the author repeatedly point out that Jesus was not a descendent of Aaron or the Levites? How does this help highlight Jesus' uniqueness as a priest?
4.	Read Hebrews 7.16. On what basis (or by what sign) is Jesus proven to be a priest that is not only different, but permanent? How does this deepen your appreciation for the significance of Jesus' resurrection?
5.	Read Hebrews 7.19. What are some ways you have sought significance, security, help, or community apart from Jesus Christ? Why is it so important to remember and trust in Jesus as a priest who alone can give you these things as you draw near to God? How is Jesus truly "a better hope" for experiencing all of these things?
