



*The Scripture Reading: Numbers 21.4-9 and John 3.9-15

Numbers 21.4-9

- From Mount Hor they set out by the way to the Red Sea, to go around the land of Edom. And the people became impatient on the way.
- ⁵ And the people spoke against God and against Moses, "Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For there is no food and no water, and we loathe this worthless food."
- ⁶ Then the LORD sent fiery serpents among the people, and they bit the people, so that many people of Israel died.
- ⁷ And the people came to Moses and said, "We have sinned, for we have spoken against the LORD and against you. Pray to the LORD, that He take away the serpents from us." So Moses prayed for the people.
- ⁸ And the LORD said to Moses, "Make a fiery serpent and set it on a pole, and everyone who is bitten, when he sees it, shall live."

- ¹³ No one has ascended into heaven except He who descended from heaven, the Son of Man.





SERMON NOTES

Numbers 21.4-9 and John 3.9-15 "The Curse That Cures"

Discussion Questions

The following questions help us engage with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this morning's worship service, and may be useful during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship.

1.	Why were the Israelites grumbling? Why was it wrong for them to be speaking out against God? How do you personally relate to the temptation to grumble against God?
2.	Read Genesis 3. How has a snake been used to symbolize a curse throughout Scripture? How is it being used in Numbers 21?
3.	Read 2 Kings 18.3-5. King Hezekiah destroys the bronze snake as it has become a place of idol worship. How does this help us understand the role of the bronze snake in the Numbers 21 passage?
4.	Read John 3.14-15 and John 8.28. How does Jesus telling the Pharisees that they would be the ones to lift up the Son of Man impact how we read John 3 and Numbers 21?
5.	Read Isaiah 52.13. What two actions are being referred to in the Son of Man being lifted up? How does looking at the Son of Man's resurrection and ascension give us life?
